Lent is a time to listen....

Now as we enter the Second Week of Lent, our task is to continue to examine our hearts and to repent in order to prepare ourselves for the glorious paschal mystery. The Gospel this weekend speaks of the transfiguration of Jesus in the presence of His disciples. This was manifesting to them His divinity to strengthen them in their faith before He enters into His Passion and death on the cross.

The invitation to "Listen to him" is directed to the disciples and us. We need to pray and listen to what God says during this Lent and yet we know God has no need of our prayer, in fact the very desire to pray is a gift from God. Jesus' invitation to "repent and believe in the Gospel" rings in our ears. We are reminded that He continually calls us to rejoice in the life that has been given us and to experience it in its fullness. Repentance or turning back to God involves all aspects of life.

During the Lenten week ahead, we have the opportunity to reflect on our "listening. We sometimes forget to listen to God's voice, especially when we are distracted by things our lives. Today we might consider our "listening". The ability to hear and listen are great gifts that we have received from God. Silence is a good place to listen not to music or news or sports stories, but to the voice of the Lord. The Lord speaks in the silence of our hearts and the only way we can listen is to enter into the quiet. The time spent in silence will enable us to "listen to him."

We spend our lives listening to the Lord as He speaks to us in His word and in and through the circumstances of our lives. We listen to Him as a preparation for that wonderful moment when in eternity we see Him face to face and we can finally say, 'it is wonderful to be here'. As we do so, we can hear the words of the Father over and over: "This is my chosen Son; listen to him."

This weekend we are being called to listen in two directions: listen to one another; to God speaking in the world around us. Never doubt that God wants to speak to us – not only during this Lenten season but all the time. He loves to speak peace into our lives. So stop and listen today. Stop and listen and pray every day.

Tereesa is a Gamilaroi woman from Western Sydney who struggled with homelessness while raising her four children. At just 16 years old, she had to leave school after falling pregnant with her first child. A single mother struggling with homelessness, Tereesa's only concern was finding stabil-



ity for her children. Seeking a better future for her family, Tereesa joined Baabayn Aboriginal Corporation's Young Mums and Bubs Group, supported by Caritas Australia. Baabayn helped Tereesa access housing and psychological support. Today, Tereesa is studying a certificate in Community Services so that she can strengthen her skills and give back to her community.

Tereesa now works at Baabayn, providing support to young mothers and mentoring the next generation of young people.

2nd Sunday of Lent - Year A

First Reading: (Genesis 12:1-4)

The Lord said to Abram, 'Leave your country, your family and your father's house, for the land I will show you. I will make you a great nation; I will bless you and make your name so famous that it will be used as a blessing.

'I will bless those who bless you:

I will curse those who slight you.

All the tribes of the earth shall bless themselves by you.'

So Abram went as the Lord told him.

Responsorial Psalm: (Ps 32:4-5. 18-20. 22)

Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you.

Second Reading: (2 Tm 1:8-10)

With me, bear the hardships for the sake of the Good News, relying on the power of God who has saved us and called us to be holy – not because of anything we ourselves have done but for his own purpose and by his own grace. This grace had already been granted to us, in Christ Jesus, before the beginning of time, but it has only been revealed by the Appearing of our saviour Christ Jesus. He abolished death, and he has proclaimed life and immortality through the Good News.

Gospel Acclamation


Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ! From the shining cloud the Father's voice is heard: this is my beloved Son, hear him. Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!

Gospel: (Matthew 17:1-9)

Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone. There in their presence he was transfigured; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as the light. Suddenly Moses and Elijah appeared to them; they were talking with him. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Lord,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow, and from the cloud there came a voice which said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.' When they heard this, the disciples fell on their faces, overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. 'Stand up,' he said 'do not be afraid.' And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order. 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.'
