Fifth Sunday of Lent - Year A

26th March 2023



Coming out of the Tomb....

It is nearly Palm Sunday and Holy Week, but not quite yet! There is still a week to go. We are entering the Fifth Sunday of Lent. In our Gospel this weekend we see how Jesus was invited into the lives of Mary and Martha and even when they thought nothing else could be done, He raised their brother Lazarus from the tomb. Their situation changed completely. It went from mourning to rejoicing. Maybe, at this moment, we also feel like we're in a tomb. Perhaps, we may have lost a loved one, or missed a great opportunity, or have been diagnosed with a terminal illness or feeling that all hope is lost. Do not despair, remember, God can raise you from your grave and restore you to an even better condition. Have you invited Him in prayer to come to help you? If you have done that, then wait. Though His response may not be immediate, He will certainly never disappoint.

It is significant to know that Lazarus means "God is my help". He represents all of us who lie helplessly in the tomb of sin awaiting Jesus to raise us to life. We often bind ourselves with chains of addictions and bury ourselves in the tomb of despair. Sometimes we are in the tomb of selfishness, filled with negative feelings. Today, as we approach Holy Week, Jesus calls out to us "Come out". He wants to raise us from our tomb of sins. When we receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, Jesus calls our name and commands, "Come out"! As Lazarus answered this call, so are we also required to answer the call to rise from sin and return to a life of righteousness.

We look to the life that is not just an extension of our physical life here on earth but an eternal life in heaven. This eternal life begins the moment we give up our sinful ways and follow a righteous life. This can be the beginning of eternity. Jesus is calling us. We are all Lazarus. He is calling us to come out of the darkness, and come into His Light. He is calling us to come out of the place of death and come into His Life. Lent may be coming to its final days, but there is still time for us to receive the Sacrament of Penance. There is still time left for our Lenten cleaning. Take the opportunity to be at peace with ourselves and with our Lord.

Readings

5th Sunday of Lent - Year A

First Reading: (Ezekiel 37:12-14)

The Lord says this: I am now going to open your graves; I mean to raise you from your graves, my people, and lead you back to the soil of Israel. And you will know that I am the Lord, when I open your graves and raise you from your graves, my people. And I shall put my spirit in you, and you will live, and I shall resettle you on your own soil; and you will know that I, the Lord, have said and done this – it is the Lord who speaks.

Responsorial Psalm: (Ps 129)

With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption.

Second Reading: (Romans 8:8-11)

People who are interested only in unspiritual things can never be pleasing to God. Your interests, however, are not in the unspiritual, but in the spiritual, since the Spirit of God has made his home in you. In fact, unless you possessed the Spirit of Christ you would not belong to him. Though your body may be dead it is because of sin, but if Christ is in you then your spirit is life itself because you have been justified; and if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, then he who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your own mortal bodies through his Spirit living in you.

Gospel Acclamation

Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ! I am the resurrection and the life, says the Lord; whoever believes in me will not die for ever. Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!

Gospel: (John 11:3-7. 17. 20-27. 33-45)

The sisters Martha and Mary sent this message to Jesus, 'Lord, the man you love is ill.' On receiving the message, Jesus said, 'This sickness will end not in death but in God's glory, and through it the Son of God will be glorified.'

Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus, yet when he heard that Lazarus was ill he stayed where he was for two more days before saying to the disciples, 'Let us go to Judaea.'

On arriving, Jesus found that Lazarus had been in the tomb for four days already. When Martha heard that Jesus had come she went to meet him. Mary remained sitting in the house. Martha said to Jesus, 'If you had been here, my brother would not have died, but I know that even now, whatever you ask of God, he will grant you.' 'Your brother' said Jesus to her 'will rise again.' Martha said, 'I know he will rise again at the resurrection on the last day.' Jesus said:

'I am the resurrection and the life. If anyone believes in me, even though he dies he will live,

and whoever lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?'

'Yes, Lord,' she said 'I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who was to come into this world.' Jesus said in great distress, with a sigh that came straight from the heart, 'Where have you put him?' They said, 'See how much he loved him!' But there were some who remarked, 'He opened the eyes of the blind man, could he not have prevented this man's death?' Still sighing, Jesus reached the tomb: it was a cave with a stone to close the opening. Jesus said, 'Take the stone away.' Martha said to him, 'Lord, by now he will smell; this is the fourth day.' Jesus replied, 'Have I not told you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?' So they took away the stone. Then Jesus lifted up his eyes and said:

'Father, I thank you for hearing my prayer. I knew indeed that you always hear me, but I speak for the sake of all these who stand round me, so that they may believe it was you who sent me.'

When he had said this, he cried in a loud voice, 'Lazarus, here! Come out!' The dead man came out, his feet and hands bound with bands of stuff and a cloth round his face. Jesus said to them, 'Unbind him, let him go free.' Many of the Jews who had come to visit Mary and had seen what he did believed in him.
