Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son and the Holy Spirit

TRIUNE NATURE OF GOD.... Of all the great feasts we celebrate within the Church throughout the year, today's Solemnity presents us with a Mystery that is so deep. On the Sunday following Pentecost, we are invited to give specific thought to what we believe about the triune nature of God. We acknowledge that God is revealed to us in God's relationship with the Son and Holy Spirit. Saint Augustine reminded Christians that: the Doctrine of Holy Trinity is a mystery of God, and no one on earth can fully understand it. We only believe in it. However, the Doctrine of Holy Trinity reveals to us one thing: "God is love." In other words, in God, there is only love and harmony. Although the Three Divine Persons do different things, they are always together from eternity to eternity. The question we must ask ourselves is what is the quality of our relationship with God and with our neighbours?

We cannot be in a good relationship with God if we don't attempt to be in the right relationship with others. Rooted within the command to love, we are called to walk humbly with God in our faith journey. Christianity isn't a private religion that seeks only our relationship with God. The way we live our relationship with God among others is the way we can define our Christian life. We must stay connected with God and each other. When we celebrated Pentecost last week, we acknowledged the power of the Holy Spirit that transforms and strengthens us to evangelize people of every race, language, and culture. We are called to share God's love that draws us into the mystery of the Trinity. This is the model for the life of every Christian. We are consistently called to touch the very presence of God. We are made in the image and likeness of God who dwells among us and offers us new reasons to hope, to be united with one another, and to live in God's love day by day.

As we celebrate the feast of the Most Holy Trinity this weekend, each of us has to live the doctrine of the Holy Trinity by building love and harmony. In the Eucharist, we are connected together by the Trinitarian love. In Eucharist, the Father loves becomes real: "God so loved the world that He gave us his Only Son." Every time we celebrate the Eucharist, we have to set the Trinity love as a perfect model for all of our relationships with God and with others.

The Reinstitution of Holy Communion Under Both Species



The Archbishop of Brisbane, has advised that the provision of Communion under both species (the Body and Blood of Christ) is able to be reintroduced safely at this time. Undoubtedly, Holy Communion under both species illustrates Christ's intention that we eat His Body and drink His Blood. The purpose, then, of receiving Holy Communion under both kinds, is not that the

faithful receive more grace than when they receive it under one kind alone, but that we are enabled to appreciate vividly the value of the sign. In short, we are in full communion with God in the reception of the Body of Christ alone. If you have any concerns about receiving the Blood of Christ, please understand and know that it is not required. It is emphasised, however, that if you are unwell that you refrain from receiving from the chalice or receiving communion on the tongue. Moreover, please note: Intinction (dipping the Consecrated Host, into the Precious Blood) is not customary and is discouraged. With the reintroduction of the Chalice, this will also mean an increase in the number of Ministers of Communion required across our Masses. Our Communion Ministers have all to be retrained in the safe sharing of the Chalice. So please receive the Blood of Christ from the Feast of the Body and Blood of Christ onward; if you feel comfortable doing so.


THIS WEEKEND Camp Hill St Vincent de Paul group is seeking your financial assistance to enable us to support those in need in our area as they battle
