Reflect, Repent and Restore....

Each year we are blessed with the gift of this holy season to examine our lives, root out whatever is not of God, and allow ourselves to be more conformed to the goodness for which He created us. On Ash Wednesday we began the season of Lent. We have six weeks preparation for Easter. Lent does not have quite the same practices it used to have. Yet, an important season is beginning. As a Church we have set out on a journey which will end at the Easter Triduum, those three great days of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday. This season of Lent is a time of special grace an opportunity to do some cleansing in our lives and enjoy new life as a result.

Therefore, the Church refers to this season as a joyful time, because it is our preparation for the future joy of Easter that approaches us bringing His blessings, mercy and forgiveness. To practice sincere repentance, the Lord God tells us to change our hearts. We are called to examine our inner most self, those evil ways that we are to let go, once and for all. We must always remember that our God is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. He will not punish us if we are sincere and turn away from our sins. God is not a God of punishment but a God of love for those who strive earnestly to walk in His righteous ways. As we enter the Lenten Season, remember these words every day that our God is a loving and merciful God.

The Gospel reading for the first Sunday of Lent is always the temptation of Jesus. Let us conquer our temptations as Jesus did by prayer, penance, and drawing strength from the word and grace of God. Hence, during this Lent, let us acknowledge our evil tendencies by talking to God, by listening to Him speaking to us through the Holy Bible, and by practicing selfcontrol over our evil tendencies, by participating in the Holy Mass, if possible, a few days in the week, setting aside some part of our day for personal prayer. It is a most appropriate time to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance, therefore in our parish we will have many opportunities for this. Individual confession/reconciliation is available before Mass on every Saturday from 5.00 pm to 5.20 pm or after weekday Masses by reauest.




ST STEPHEN'S CATHEDRAL MESSAGE STICK



Readings

1st Sunday of Lent —Year B

First Reading: (Genesis 9:8-15)

God spoke to Noah and his sons, 'See, I establish my Covenant with you, and with your descendants after you; also with every living creature to be found with you, birds, cattle and every wild beast with you: everything that came out of the ark, everything that lives on the earth. I establish my Covenant with you: no thing of flesh shall be swept away again by the waters of the flood. There shall be no flood to destroy the earth again.'

God said, 'Here is the sign of the Covenant I make between myself and you and every living creature with you for all generations: I set my bow in the clouds and it shall be a sign of the Covenant between me and the earth. When I gather the clouds over the earth and the bow appears in the clouds, I will recall the Covenant between myself and you and every living creature of every kind. And so the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all things of flesh.'

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 24:4-9

Your ways, O Lord, are love and truth to those who keep your covenant.

Second Reading: (1 Peter 3:18-22)

Christ himself, innocent though he was, died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life, and, in the spirit, he went to preach to the spirits in prison. Now it was long ago, when Noah was still building that ark which saved only a small group of eight people 'by water', and when God was still waiting patiently, that these spirits refused to believe. That water is a type of the baptism which saves you now, and which is not the washing off of physical dirt but a pledge made to God from a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has entered heaven and is at God's right hand, now that he has made the angels and Dominations and Powers his subjects.

Gospel Acclamation: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, king of endless glory!

Gospel: (Mark 1:12-15)

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the wilderness and he remained there for forty days, and was tempted by Satan. He was with the wild beasts, and the angels looked after him. After John had been arrested, Jesus went into Galilee. There he proclaimed the Good News from God. 'The time has come' he said 'and the kingdom of God is close at hand. Repent, and believe the Good News.'

Today we begin the season of Lent, a time to prepare our hearts for the new lite which Jesus brings at Easter. Lent

lasts for forty days, just as Jesus spent forty days in the desert before going out to share the Good News. It is a season of hope and new life, as days lengthen and spring approaches.
