Ready to let go and let God....

Lent is a time of prayer and renewal and an opportunity to refocus our relationship with God. This leads us to the Easter Sunday celebration of our risen Christ. We are just one week away from Holy Week - celebrating God's love shown in the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus. It is a time of special grace in which we experience the presence of a personal God who cares and loves us. Our response is to open ourselves and live according to His will. Turning back to God is what our Lenten journey is about, acknowledging our sins and returning to the joyful purpose of our lives. The call for repentance is one that is fundamental to our Catholic Christian tradition. And the Sacrament of Reconciliation is one of the greatest gifts offered as an opportunity for real conversion, healing, and happiness deep within. To do so, we need the grace of God given to us in the sacrament.

"I tell you most solemnly, it remains only a single grain;

As we approach Holy Week beginning next Sunday with Palm Sunday, let us recall the Passion of our Lord Jesus, who took up that cross and suffered for us, so that by gathering all of our sins to Himself, He redeemed us all, His beloved people. Let us keep away from our past sins and wickedness, the things we have done in disobedience against God and walk from now on in His ways. I would like to remind you that the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession), the first Rite takes place in our parish for Lent, after the 6.30 pm Stations of the Cross on Friday 22nd March.

Let us also draw closer to God this Lent, by deepening our relationship with Him through prayer, that in everything, we do it prayerfully, knowing that God is with us, and that we exist to be with God. Let us all show our commitment to Him by devoting our lives more wholeheartedly to Him through our active participation in the Holy Week liturgies.

So today, let us learn to see Jesus, the Jesus of the Gospel. The Jesus who let go of everything for us and who invites us to be with him all the way. Let us pray for His courage and trust in His Father, that the life and happiness and fulfilment we all long for is in that letting go and letting God.



Readings

5th Sunday of Lent —Year B

First Reading: (Jeremiah 31:31-34)

See, the days are coming – it is the Lord who speaks – when I will make a new covenant with the House of Israel and the House of Judah, but not a covenant like the one I made with their ancestors on the day I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt. They broke that covenant of mine, so I had to show them who was master. It is the Lord who speaks. No, this is the covenant I will make with the House of Israel when those days arrive – it is the Lord who speaks. Deep within them I will plant my Law, writing it on their hearts. Then I will be their God and they shall be my people. There will be no further need for neighbour to try to teach neighbour, or brother to say to brother, 'Learn to know the Lord!' No, they will all know me, the least no less than the greatest – it is the Lord who speaks – since I will forgive their iniquity and never call their sin to mind.

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 50:3-4. 12-15.

Create a clean heart in me, O God.

Second Reading: (Hebrews 5:7-9)

During his life on earth, Christ offered up prayer and entreaty, aloud and in silent tears, to the one who had the power to save him out of death, and he submitted so humbly that his prayer was heard. Although he was Son, he learnt to obey through suffering; but having been made perfect, he became for all who obey him the source of eternal salvation.

'Now the hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified.

I tell you most solemnly, unless a wheat grain falls on the ground and dies,

it remains only a single grain; but if it dies,

Anyone who loves his life loses it; anyone who hates his life in this world will keep it for the eternal life. If a man serves me, he must follow me,

wherever I am, my servant will be there too.

If anyone serves me, my Father will honour him.

Now my soul is troubled.

What shall I say: Father, save me from this hour?

But it was for this very reason that I have come to this hour.

Father, glorify your name!'

A voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.'

People standing by, who heard this, said it was a clap of thunder; others said, 'It was an angel speaking to him.' Jesus answered, 'It was not for my sake that this voice came, but for yours.

'Now sentence is being passed on this world; now the prince of this world is to be overthrown.

And when I am lifted up from the earth, I shall draw all men to myself."

By these words he indicated the kind of death he would die.
