In the course of our busy week, we most likely have times set apart for certain things that are important to renew ourselves, our energy, and our perspective. Holy Week is a time specifically in our Church's liturgical year for our spiritual renewal. In fact, the word Holy refers to anything that is set apart for God's purposes. It is Holy precisely because it is an opportunity for us to focus on how we are spiritually renewed through the suffering, death, and Resurrection of Jesus. This is the time of year we stop to remember and relive the events which brought about our redemption and salvation. What we commemorate this week is not just Jesus' dying and rising, but our own dying and rising in Him, which results in our healing, reconciliation, and redemption. Attentive participation in the Holy Week liturgies deepens our relationship with God, increases our Faith and strengthens our resolve as disciples of Jesus.

The liturgies of Holy Week are filled with some of the richest and most ancient symbols of our faith tradition. The waving of palms on **Passion (Palm) Sunday** reminds us that we are called to be followers of Jesus, not just observers who cheer from a distance. We begin with the Mass on **Thursday of the Lord's** Supper, a most beautiful Mass that will be celebrated at **6.30 pm**. The washing of feet on Holy Thursday speaks to us of the selfless love that we are called to practice as disciples of Jesus. For those who can remain, a period of silent adoration will follow until 8.30 pm. On **Good Friday** we have the **Stations** of the Cross at 10 am. The Liturgy of the passion of the Lord on Friday at 3.00 pm takes us deeply into the mystery of the power of Christ's love. It expresses perfectly His complete self-offering on the Cross. The veneration of the cross on Good Friday reminds us that, as Christians, we believe that Jesus overcomes everything, even death. Good Friday is a day of fasting and abstinence as a way to particularly unite ourselves to the Lord's passion. All Catholics in good health aged 18 to 60 are required to fast.

The Great Vigil of Easter - a service **at 6.30 pm** is the first official celebration of the Resurrection of Jesus. It is an opportunity for all of us to gather as one parish community and celebrates the great mystery of our faith. Then on **Easter Sunday**, there will be **8.30 am** Sunday Mass only. Everyone is welcome and encouraged to participate in all the Triduum Liturgies. Have a blessed Holy week.

PROJECT COMPASSION

Sixth Sunday of Lent (Palm Sunday) 23 & 24 February

This year, we shared with you the story of three inspiring women from across the globe, who overcame challenges to complete their education, access water and find secure employment. With the support of compassion-

ate people like you, they are now forging a path to a better future for their families and their communities.

Ronita from the Philippines has now graduated high school and secured a job at a call centre. This job was only possible because of a certificate she gained from completing her studies.

Leaia and her family now have a water tank at their home in Samoa. She and her family now have a steady supply of clean drinking water. Next year, they will also have a toilet built, with the support of Caritas Samoa, which will further improve their health and living conditions.

Memory completed her vocational training course in carpentry and joinery. After completing a work contract at one of the largest electrical companies in Malawi, Memory now plans to return to her village and provide carpentry services to people in her community. It's

through the generosity of people like you that we can continue to support people like Ronita, Leaia and Memory. There is still time to donate! Together, we can help vulnerable communities face their challenges



today and build a better tomorrow, for all future generations.

HOLY LAND COLLECTION

The annual collection for the support of the church in the Holy Land will take place on Good Friday, March 29th. This collection promotes the missionary work of the Church in the Holy Land by providing welfare assistance to local Christians in areas such as health, education, employment, housing. Parishes, and orphanages. It is also used to maintain over 70 churches and shrines associated with the life of Jesus. Due to the ongoing war, the Church and people of the Holy Land are still struggling with reduced income due to fewer pilgrims and lower church attendance around the world. In 2023 Australian Catholics were once again extremely generous and we were able to send to the Holy Land nearly \$1.4 million [\$1.4 million (2022), \$1,126,098 (2021), \$406,023 (2020) and \$1.3 million (2019)]. The reality for the Holy Land mission is that they will continue to face challenges financial and spiritual and so we again ask Catholics around the world again to be as generous as possible, with their financial support as well as the spiritual support. Please remember the Christians of the Holy Land on Good Friday.

A reminder that we will be taking up collection at both the Stations of the Cross and Passion of the Lord on Good Friday to support the Holy Land Collection. Please remember to bring some cash—your support is appreciated. Thank you.

First Reading: (Isaiah 50:4-7)

The Lord has given me a disciple's tongue. So that I may know how to reply to the wearied he provides me with speech. Each morning he wakes me to hear, to listen like a disciple. The Lord has opened my ear. For my part, I made no resistance, neither did I turn away. I offered my back to those who struck me, my cheeks to those who tore at my beard; I did not cover my face against insult and spittle. The Lord comes to my help, so that I am untouched by the insults. So, too, I set my face like flint; I know I shall not be shamed.

Second Reading: (Philippians 2:6-11)
