ALLELUIA, ALLELUIA! CHRIST

EASTER: A Mystery Beyond Words.... IF CHRIST HAD NOT RISEN, then our faith would have no meaning. Easter, not Good Friday, is the climax of Holy Week. The resurrection is not just an appendix to Jesus' death, a "proof" of His divinity. Jesus leads the way by going through death to a life that can never again be taken away._"We know that Christ, being raised from death, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over Him." And that life is shared with us. "I have come that they may have life, life in abundance", says Jesus. The resurrection is deeply mysterious and we can't quite comprehend its original impact in the hearts and minds of His followers. Am I like Magdalene, announcing the news of resurrection? Or like the Apostles who respond immediately by running off to the tomb to see for themselves. On Easter morning, the stone was rolled back from the mouth of the tomb. Is my heart like a tomb awaiting resurrection? Can I identify any gravestone that is holding me back from a life more full and free? It could be a habit or an addiction, a compulsion or some dark secret that holds us back. As Pope Francis said, we are meant to be "people of joyful hope, not doomsday prophets!" If we too follow the risen Jesus, we can all find hope and joy, and go out to share them with others.
