# The LORD is my

Giving life willingly....

Once a man was returning home from a weekly market with his purchases. It was dark and the path was very narrow. Accidentally he slipped and fell \_\_into a cold mucky pond. He was stuck and worse still he went on sinking in the muck. He then kept on shouting. After a while, a man was passing that way in a cart and when he heard the cry, he stopped. He threw a rope to the man, tied it to his horse, and rescued him. Then he took the near unconscious man to his home, washed off the muck and wrapped him in a blanket. The man recovered in a couple of days and ready to go home. The injured man thanked his benefactor for the favour done and asked his name. He replied that there was no need to know and he should go and relax. When the person still insisted the good man asked him a guestion, whether he knew the story of the Good Samaritan in the Bible. The man responded positively. Then the Benefactor ask if he knew the name of the Good Samaritan then he would reveal his name. The man thought a while and said it is not recorded in the Bible. Nor will I tell you mine, he replied. Kindly go and pray for me and be a Good Samaritan.

The fourth Sunday of Easter is known as Good Shepherd Sunday. It is also World Day of Prayer for Vocations. The scripture lessons are about shepherds. Each year on this Sunday we reflect on the image of Jesus as the Good Shepherd, faithfully taking care of His flock. The Gospel text offers us both comfort and challenge. The comforting good news is that Jesus the Good Shepherd knows us, provides for us and loves us. The challenge is that we should be good shepherds to those entrusted to our care. These are the characteristics of the Good Shepherd: total self-giving, unconditional love, intimate knowledge and union with His flock, sincere concern and at the

service of unity among all people.

God is calling every single one of us to work for the Gospel. For a small number it may be as a priest or religious – and that call can come at any time in one's life. But there are hundreds of other ways of serving the Church and helping to build up the Christian community. Where is God calling me to make my own unique contribution based on the particular talents God has given me? If every single one us were to answer that question sincerely and to act upon it, it is likely that our Church would have all the leadership it needs. Today let us pray for our priests and all those who have given themselves to God living in the world and in the religious life: monks, nuns, lay and religious missionaries and ministers...let us also ask with faith and constancy for more vocations to the priesthood and religious life.





# Fourth Sunday of Easter —Year B

# First Reading: (Acts of the Apostles 4:8-12)

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Peter said: 'Rulers of the people, and elders! If you are questioning us today about an act of kindness to a cripple, and asking us how he was healed, then I am glad to tell you all, and would indeed be glad to tell the whole people of Israel, that it was by the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, the one you crucified, whom God raised from the dead, by this name and by no other that this man is able to stand up perfectly healthy, here in your presence, today. This is the stone rejected by you the builders, but which has proved to be the keystone. For of all the names in the world given to men, this is the only one by which we can be saved.'

Responsorial Psalm: Ps 117:1. 8-9. 21-23. 26. 28-29

The stone rejected by the builders has become the cornerstone.

# Second Reading: (1 John 3:1-2)

Think of the love that the Father has lavished on us, by letting us be called God's children; and that is what we are.

Because the world refused to acknowledge him,

therefore it does not calculated up

therefore it does not acknowledge us.

My dear people, we are already the children of God

but what we are to be in the future has not yet been revealed;

all we know is, that when it is revealed

we shall be like him

because we shall see him as he really is.

# Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia!

I am the good shepherd, says the Lord; I know my sheep, and mine know me.

Alleluia!

# Gospel: (John 10:11-18)

Jesus said: 'I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep.

The hired man, since he is not the shepherd

and the sheep do not belong to him, abandons the sheep and runs away

as soon as he sees a wolf coming, and then the wolf attacks and scatters the sheep;

this is because he is only a hired man

and has no concern for the sheep. I am the good shepherd;

I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me

and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for my sheep.

And there are other sheep I have that are not of this fold, and these I have to lead as well.

They too will listen to my voice, and there will be only one flock

and one shepherd. The Father loves me, because I lay down my life

in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me; I lay it down of my own free will.

and as it is in my power to lay it down, so it is in my power to take it up again;

and this is the command I have been given by my Father.'
